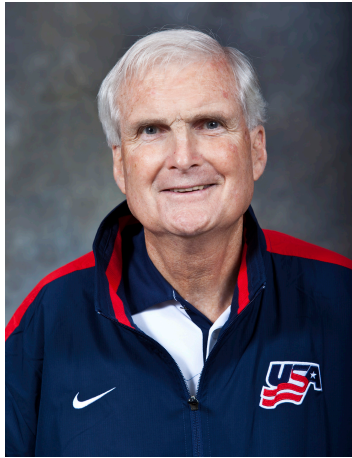

The Eugene Kinasewich Fund has lost one of its Founders. Tim Taylor passed away on April 27th.

As a Kinasewich Fund Board member, Timmy was always available and ready to help either the Board or a Fund recipient. His years of experience coaching both college and USA hockey teams were a great help in guiding and advising the Board in the task of helping Gene Fund recipients become student athletes. His love of coaching and teaching was evident in his compassion for, and involvement with fund recipients. He would think nothing of doing a six hour round trip drive to a hockey game in order to encourage or advise one of the Funds' recipients. That trip was always in addition to his on-going hockey obligations.



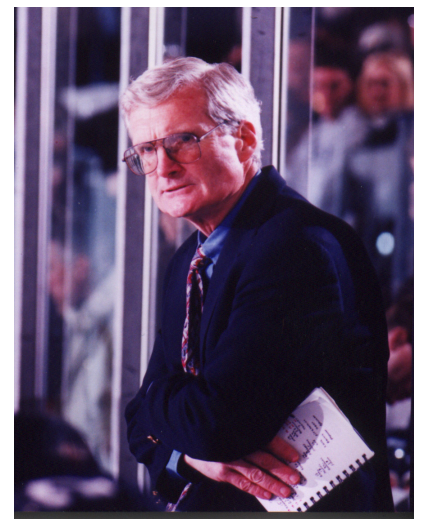
Timmy and Gene Kinasewich were teammates and friends at Harvard. The game of ice hockey was a year-round passion for both Tim and Gene. In the summer of 1974, Tim and Gene took a group of Boston area students to Russia in order to experience hockey as a vehicle for international exchange and good will.

It was natural for Tim, the well known Yale, US Olympic, and US World Cup team hockey coach, to enthusiastically join the effort to help Gene found a fund that would empower a group of young men and women to find a way to have their passion and talent for hockey lead them to realize educational goals and experiences. Tim's knowledge of the New England secondary schools and the process of applying for college was crucial in helping both Gene Fund recipients and the Board navigate the application process. He was always selfless and would act as an active participant in the process of helping students transition from secondary school to college, in addition to being a life coach for many recipients.

The success stories of thirty Gene Fund recipients are a testament to the diligence and compassion of Tim Taylor. We will miss his contributions. A Board meeting with Tim present was always a positive for all those involved in the Gene Fund mission.

Tim Taylor was a hockey purist who became a life teacher over the course of his coaching career. He was a gift to those he coached, those he coached with, and the Board of the Eugene Kinasewich Fund.

Tim Taylor leaves a meaningful guidepost for life; follow your passion and do it well!
